Through the band's 61-year trajectory, **La Sonora Dinamita's** sound originated from Colombia that has become a vital part of Latino music history and celebrations. A respected professional band with the most popular Cumbia style group. La Sonora Dinamita with Vilma Díaz provides interpreted Latin rhythm within the Latin tropical genre living a joyful existence to all of their listeners. Vilma Diaz is known for her popular song <u>"Escandalo."</u>

Los Van Van are one of the most important and <u>influential bands in the history of 20th century Cuban</u> <u>pop music</u>. They are widely recognized as a genre-creating band. Alongside artists like the Beatles, Aretha Franklin, and Creedence Clearwater Revival, Los Van Van are distinguished as a band that changed the course of popular music for an entire generation. One of their popular songs is <u>"Se Acabo</u> <u>Se Acabo</u> and <u>more</u>.

History of Carnaval San Francisco:

The event's 2023 theme, "45 Years of Music & Movement," was chosen to pay homage to the artists that have shaped our multicultural and multigenerational celebration.

"Artists in our beloved Mission District gave birth to Carnaval in 1978 with the belief that their passion for Latin, Caribbean and Afro-Diasporic music would unite people across ethnicities, nationalities, sexual orientation, gender identification or religious beliefs," said Rodrigo Duran, Executive Director of Carnaval San Francisco. "From the beginning, the sounds of salsa, samba, soca, mariachi, merengue, cumbia, and reggae music paved the way for Carnaval to thrive. Now modern sounds such as funk, bachata, dancehall, hip-hop, Afro-beats and reggaeton have joined the mix, resonating with the younger generation of revelers." "For 45 years Carnaval San Francisco has featured world-class artists such as **Santana, Tower of Power, Celia Cruz, Oscar de Leon, Los Lonely Boys, Tito Puente, La India, John Santos, Olodum**, and **Los Tigres del Norte**. We are proud that these high caliber performances are provided to our community, free-of-charge and open to all ages," continued Duran.

Carnaval San Francisco Festival will be held Saturday and Sunday, May 27 & 28, 2023 from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. Taking place on Harrison Street between 16th and 24th streets, the festival will feature a rich assortment of food, music, dance, arts, crafts, the new tech and gaming pavilion, the cannabis garden and other fun activities and entertainment on several stages for people of all ages to enjoy.

The **Grand Parade** on Sunday, May 28, begins at 9:30 a.m. and will start at the corner of 24th and Bryant streets, proceed west to Mission Street, head north on Mission to 15th Street, turn east on 15th and conclude at South Van Ness. With a brilliant procession of contingents, most of which will feature beautifully adorned floats depicting rich multicultural themes and featuring performers who engage and entertain the crowds.
