Carnaval San Francisco To Bring World Cup Energy and “La Copa Del Pueblo” To The Mission District

The 48th Annual Festival Debuts Community Soccer Experience, “La Plaza del Fútbol,” Celebrating the People’s Game Ahead of the World Cup



San Francisco, CA – April 15, 2026 – Carnaval San Francisco, one of the largest festivals on the West Coast, is bringing the energy of the world’s game to the Mission District with the debut of “La Copa del Pueblo – The People’s Cup” at its 48th annual celebration, taking place May 23–24, 2026.

As the Bay Area prepares to host matches for the world’s premier sporting event, the 48th annual Carnaval San Francisco —taking place **May 23–24, 2026**— is leaning into the moment with the theme “La Copa del Pueblo- The People’s Cup” by incorporating a soccer arena to the festival- *La Plaza del Fútbol*. It will be a space for soccer enthusiasts of all ages to participate in various activities: scrimmages, skill building, 3-on-3 matches, youth clinics, giveaways, and fan experiences in collaboration with the Bay Area Host Committee and Bay Area soccer teams.

“This partnership marks an exciting moment for Carnaval San Francisco and the communities we serve,” said Rodrigo Duran, Executive Director of Carnaval San Francisco. “For nearly five decades, Carnaval has celebrated culture and community. “Carnaval is more than a party, it’s a powerful economic engine, drawing thousands of attendees and driving nearly \$20 million annually into local businesses, food and arts vendors, while creating opportunities for small businesses and entrepreneurs. By bringing soccer into the celebration, we are connecting our local traditions to a world stage.”

Partnerships with the Bay Area Host Committee and Bay Area Soccer Teams

The Bay Area Host Committee (BAHC) is a non-profit organization that unites the Bay Area by partnering with local teams, civic leaders, and businesses to drive lasting economic, cultural and social impact by bringing mega sporting events like the World Cup to the region. The organization is responsible for managing regional festivities across the Bay Area to ensure that the road to the World Cup 2026 reflects the diversity and spirit of the Bay Area.

“Carnaval San Francisco captures the spirit of the Bay Area, where culture, community, and sport come together” said Patty Hubbard, Chief Marketing Officer of the Bay Area Host Committee. “Soccer is a universal language that unites culture and community, and this event brings the excitement of the World Cup directly to the people.”

Bay Area professional soccer teams will be a part of festival programming throughout San Francisco's Mission District. Activities will include youth clinics, community matches, cultural performances, and fan experiences with additional programming to be announced in the coming weeks. Teams include San Jose Earthquakes, Bay FC, Oakland Roots, San Francisco Glens, SF City FC, Frisco United FC, Volo, Bay City Futsal Club, The Jamestown Community Center, and Futbol by the Bay.

This partnership highlights the understanding of the deep cultural connections and traditions between soccer and diaspora communities, which is at the heart of Carnival, while expanding access to the sport and building excitement ahead of the World Cup.

Carnaval San Francisco draws thousands of attendees annually, making it one of the largest multicultural celebrations in California. The Bay Area is one of the select host regions for the World Cup, further elevating the global significance of this year's festival.
